

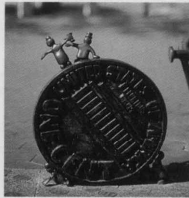

- 01 American Stock Exchange**
 Once an outdoor securities market in companies that pushed a young and growing nation westward, the American Stock Exchange now provides a state-of-the-art marketplace in the stock of mid-sized growth companies, as well as a vibrant derivatives program. - 02 World Trade Center**
 How can you get to the Top of the World in Downtown Manhattan? Stop in at the 2 World Trade Center Observation Deck and find out! Tickets required. Summer hours: 9:30 a.m. - 11:30 p.m.; otherwise, until 9:30 p.m. (212) 323-2340. Indoor shopping and snacking on the concourse. Gourmet dining at Windows on the World, 107th floor.
- 03 World Financial Center**
 Tropical palms in Manhattan? Find them in the Winter Garden, along with restaurants, shops, free concerts and events. Event line: (212) 945-0505. Visit the sparkling North Cove Marina and the New York Mercantile Exchange visitors center and trading floor galleries, just steps away.
- 04 Battery Park City**
 Battery Park City, 92 acres on the Hudson River, has gardens, plazas and parks with public art, the mile-long Esplanade, the Winter Garden, and North Cove Harbor. This residential neighborhood, partially built on landfill excavated from the World Trade Center, offers schools, playgrounds, and shops. Information: (212) 416-5300.
- 05 Museum of Jewish Heritage Robert F. Wagner, Jr. Park**
 The six-sided granite building houses photos and artifacts interspersed with 24 original films that show visitors the richness of 20th-century Jewish history. Tickets: Ticketmaster, (212) 307-4007, or the Museum box office, (212) 786-0820, x111. The 3.5-acre Wagner Park connects Battery Park City with Historic Battery Park, Pier A, the southern tip of Manhattan, and New York Harbor.
